

# Manager's Report



It is with an immense sense of pride that I look back over the past year and reflect on the achievements of our organisation. Operating in one of the fastest growing communities in Australia in a sector undergoing significant review and reform, Camden Community Connections has remained focused and united in our aim to continue to provide quality community services that support our vision of a strong and empowered community.

Camden Community Connections has been servicing the community for almost thirty years and in that time there have of course been enormous changes. Our population has become more diverse and increased from under 30 000 in 1987 to just over 77 000 in 2016; community attitudes and expectations on a wide range of issues have changed; and now we are living in the age of the internet and social media where we can have access to information and people at any time of day. Our organisation has proven experience in responding to change and is well positioned to embrace the future, whatever challenges may present.

The key factor underpinning the success of our organisation is a solidarity of purpose that is driven by a desire to provide quality services and to contribute to the development of a strong and empowered community where individuals can actively participate in community life. Standing behind the organisation, is a dedicated team of employees, volunteers, partners and friends that are united in their fundamental belief that what we are doing is important and we can change people's lives.

Our small team of staff are our greatest resource. Individually they all bring different skills and experience and this makes for a versatile and effective team. They are passionate, work hard, and are always exploring new and innovative approaches. During the year, we welcomed Firaol Tujuba who replaced our family worker Catherine Gonzaga who left to pursue new opportunities. We also welcomed Kayla Cornish to the team. Kayla replaced Teearn Page as youth worker as Teearn left to take up a position much closer to home. Our bookkeeper Elleneta Hocking left for an exciting new life in Singapore and was replaced by Joanne Fawbert.

Our Management Committee also work hard in a voluntary capacity to support the organisation. They generously give their time and expertise and both the manager and staff appreciate their invaluable contribution. Volunteers play an integral role working within the community sector and we would like to recognise and thank our small team of volunteers for the wonderful contribution they have made in supporting our programs over the past year. We also recognise the important role played by our various partners and stakeholders and thank them for their ongoing support. In an environment where there are limited resources it is really critical that we create strong partnerships with other organisations both within and external to the sector to ensure that, working together, we are able to provide effective supports for all groups across our community.

# Manager's Report

Our major grant funding comes from the NSW government and this support is critical to the ongoing sustainability of our organisation. The actual funds provided are vital but so too is the support, advice and encouragement we receive on a regular basis from the staff working within the departments. Again this year, funding from Camden Council has enabled us to develop new and innovative programs, including the establishment of a social singing group and a family fit program focusing on families exercising together. We also received funding from Urban Growth NSW to continue delivery of the community development programs at Bardia Edmondson Park and East Village Spring Farm. The details of all our program service delivery can be found in the individual program reports and we hope that you enjoy reading about the work undertaken by our staff to support the community during the past year.

The year ahead promises to be both busy and exciting as we continue to manage the challenges of effectively supporting a community rapidly increasing in size and diversity, with limited resources. Our funding agreement with NSW Family & Community Services for the provision of EIPP services has been extended for a further twelve months while the Targeted Earlier Intervention Programs reform continues and is finalised. The outcomes of this reform are eagerly awaited and will inform future planning of service delivery. We will continue to be funded by Urban Growth NSW to provide community development programs and an exciting new opportunity will see us working with Stockland to provide a community development program at the new residential development of Willowdale. As an organisation we are well prepared and looking forward to embrace future opportunities. As we head towards our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we are reflecting on our history with pride and looking towards the future with optimism.

### Children's Services

#### **FUNDING**

The Children's Services Program (CSP) is funded by the NSW Department of Education and Communities. Other financial support was received from Camden Council, John Holland, and Stockland.

#### **SUMMARY**

This year has been an exciting year as we have continued to provide a wide range of services to children and families living in our community. Camden LGA is one of the fastest growing areas in Australia and the influx of new families brings increased diversity and strength to our community. As well as providing relevant programs, services and information to meet the needs of existing families, we have also been engaged in assisting newly EVENTS / SERVICES / PROGRAMS arrived residents with their transition. The services we provide play an important role in creating opportunities for families to build a strong local support network.

Our three playgroups were all well attended during the year. Bright Eyes, held every Monday during school term is an indoor supported playgroup and Playlinks, held on a Wednesday is an outdoor supported playgroup. Bright Stars is a community playgroup held on a Thursday and the number of families and children attending this group increased substantially during the year. We also participated in two Council initiatives, the Camden Kids Fun Day in September and Camden Play Day in May. Both of these events were well attended and the children enjoyed a wide variety of activities on both days.

During the year we worked in partnership with local agencies, Northcott Disability Services and Benevolent Society to facilitate the supported playgroups. We also worked with local health service providers to provide health and development information to families. These partnerships with other local agencies are long standing and are highly valued especially as our resources are increasingly stretched as we strive to meet the needs of our growing community.

We have another valued and longstanding relationship with Leppington Public School where we held a weekly breakfast program for approximately 70-80 students and also supported their transition to school program. It is a privilege to engage with the staff and students at Leppington and we are looking forward to working together into the future.

This year our expanded Kids Club School Holiday program consisted of eleven different workshops, which were well attended and enjoyed by the participants. We also successfully facilitated a Positive Parenting Program (Triple P) in partnership with Disability Macarthur.

Camden Council provided funding for a Family Fit program which has a focus on bringing families together to exercise. The first program was incorporated into our Bright Stars playgroup during term 2 and the program in August has an Olympic theme which has generated a lot of interest from families.

We are faced with the ongoing challenge of ensuring the best use of our limited resources to meet the demands of our rapidly growing community. However, we remain passionate, committed and creative and this will support the continued delivery of quality services and support to

### Youth Services

#### **FUNDING**

The major source of funding for our Youth Service Early Intervention and Placement Prevention (EIPP) program comes from NSW Department of Family and Community Services (FACS). We also received additional funding from FACS this year for a Youth Opportunities program. Other financial support was received from Camden Council and the Camden Lioness Club.

#### **SUMMARY**

The EIPP program offers young people, and/ or their families access to case management, information, support, and referral to other services. The CCC youth team have had a successful year, engaging many young people who are at risk, disadvantaged or disengaged, with our programs and services. CCC programs provide opportunities for young people to become involved in positive experiences whether it is a recreational event, or social inclusion and early intervention support programs. During the year we have established new partnerships and we continue to engage and work with local schools, NSW Police, Camden Council and other community organisations. We value these relationships and they play an important role in supporting our team to deliver quality services to meet the needs of the increasing number of young people in our community.

During this past year programs targeting young people have included:

- A breakfast outreach program at Camden High School, providing breakfast and other support for at risk and disadvantaged students.
- Girls programs running in four local high schools and reaching out to young females that are at risk or disengaged from school. The program supports the participants to discover their full potential through participation in a range of activities; provision of information; and linking in to other support services.

- "Get Up, Stand Up" a 16 week boys program targeting disengaged young males. This program aims to build resilience; encourages self-discovery; and fosters respect and leadership within a team environment.
- Individual case management and support.
- A youth week event. This was a recreation experience held at Camp Wombaroo involving team building activities and challenges.
- A Thursday night outreach program reaching out to local young people who may be disadvantaged and/or seeking a social safe place. The program involves fun activities and refreshments and also provides the opportunity to provide relevant information and case management and referral.

With the Camden LGA expanding rapidly and increasing numbers of young people, our limited resources are stretched. However, our youth team are committed to continuing to provide ongoing effective support for young people through the delivery of quality programs and events.

### **FUNDING**

### **SUMMARY**

As one of the fastest growing areas in Australia it is vital that our community Development Team remain committed to building a strong, inclusive, connected community that supports people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities. This year we have listened to the changing needs of our community and we have identified ways to improve our community Builders Program including strengthening networks, increasing our promotional reach, utilising community infrastructure and effectively supporting volunteers. These improvements have assisted us in the effective delivery of a broader range of activities to a larger number of people. A great example of this is our Cultural Bus Tour program for seniors and our Ballroom Dancing Classes which have both grown considerably.

This year has seen us create new and innovative programs such as our Social Singers Group and our Creative Writing Program, which have both received very positive responses. In addition to this we have continued to provide a range of regular programs such as our information sessions for seniors, Active Over 50's classes and walking groups while also providing financial and legal support services to a rising number of people in our community.

### **FUNDING**

Spring Farm is funded by Urban Growth NSW.

### **SUMMARY**

CCC continued to deliver the East Village community development program through until December 2015 and then after a six month break, due to construction delays, recommenced work at East Village in July 2016. In the first two years, the East Village community program focused on building a connected community with active resident participation and during this past year we have continued to support the existing community and integrated new residents as they have arrived. The community program continued to provide the residents with an innovative range of activities and community

The Community Development Program for East Village events which were well supported. We also started to see more direct input from the residents which augurs well for the long term sustainability of a strong and connected community.

> As the East Village community has expanded, social infrastructure has been built including the Spring Farm Public School which opened in February at Narellan but moved to Spring Farm at the start of term 2. A new shopping centre also opened in May 2016 and these new facilities will be an integral part of our future community program planning.

> With the planned release of new land we are looking forward to continuing our work with the residents of East Village to build a strong sustainable community that is integrated into the surrounding areas.



### Bardia, Edmondson Park



### **FUNDING**

The community development program for Bardia, Edmondson Park is funded by Urban Growth NSW.

### **SUMMARY**

It has been a strong and productive second year at Bardia, Edmondson Park. The residential development has grown not only in size but in community spirit as more residents become engaged and actively participate in the community. The ongoing Welcome Program has been an effective way of linking in with the more than 200 homes now established and families have enjoyed an ongoing program of regular, innovative community activities and events. During the year there has been an increase in the number of residents attending activities and events with over 100 people attending the Christmas Party in December last year and there was another big turnout for Neighbour Day in March.

Bardia Public school has been very supportive of our work in Bardia. With their support we were able to hold a walk to school safely day in May this year with over 200 teachers, students and parents joining Sponge Bob to raise awareness of safety when walking to school. It was also with the schools support that we launched a fortnightly community playgroup in March 2016.

As we approach the end of our final year in Bardia, Edmondson Park we are focused on empowering the community to continue to grow together and to be strong and sustainable into the future. We will do this by focusing on identifying community leaders, supporting volunteers and integrating residents into the surrounding Camden, Campbelltown and Liverpool communities.
